

Advocacy	refer to efforts to support the settlement and integration of immigrants and refugees into their new communities.
Agenda	a list or plan of items to be discussed or accomplished during a meeting or event (e.g., Sector Call Agenda)
Anti-racism	Opposing and fighting against racism
Brief	document that provides an overview of a specific sector in a particular region or country (e.g., PEI brief)
Call for Proposals	a process where organizations can submit proposals to receive funding for a specific project or program
Capacity Building	means strengthening the abilities, skills, and resources of individuals, organizations, or communities to effectively achieve their goals and tasks
Clients	people who receive services from an organization
Committee	group of people who are responsible for addressing the needs of newcomers to a particular area (e.g., GTP Committee)
Digital literacy	having skills to live, learn, and work in a society where communication and access to information is increasingly through digital technologies like internet platforms, social media, and mobile devices.
Diversity	being different and having a mix of people with various backgrounds and abilities.
Engagement	participate or become involved in
Equity	the quality of being fair and impartial
Fiscal Agent	refers to a third-party organization that handles various financial and administrative duties on behalf of some other party
Fiscal Year	12-month period used for financial reporting and planning by businesses and organizations (i.e, IRCC runs from April 1 to March 31), not necessarily aligned with the calendar year.
Francophone	refers to someone who speaks French or belongs to a French-speaking community.
Hub	central point or a focal place where various services converge and are organized (e.g., TFW Hub)
Immigration	the act of someone coming to live in a different country
Inclusion	welcoming and involving everyone, regardless of differences
Language	system of communication using words, symbols, or gestures that enables people to express thoughts, ideas, and feelings



Newcomers	a person who has recently arrived in a place
PNT Region	Prairies and Northern Territories Region as designated by IRCC
Policy	set of rules or guidelines that guide decisions and actions within an organization or group (e.g., government).
Professional Development	process of enhancing and updating the knowledge, skills, and abilities of immigration professionals.
Refugees	people who have been forced to leave their homes due to conflict, persecution, or natural disasters and seek safety in another place or country
Refugee Claimants	individuals who have applied for refugee status and are awaiting a decision on their application
Resettlement	means moving and establishing people in a new place, often due to displacement, migration, or relocation.
Rural	means countryside or places outside cities, usually with fewer people and open spaces
Sector	a part or subdivision, especially of a society or an economy
Settlement	the process of settling in a new community
Small Centre	rural areas w/ population between 1,000 and 29,999
Teleconferences	a live audio or audiovisual meeting with two or more participants (e.g., IRCC Small Centre Teleconference).
Temporary Foreign Workers	refers to individuals from other countries who come to work in a different country for a limited time before returning to their home country.
Toolkit	a collection of resources, tools, and information that is designed to help new comers navigate a particular situation or environment (e.g., AAISA toolkit).
Umbrella Organization	a non-profit organization that represents and provides services to other organizations in a particular sector (e.g., AAISA).
Urban	means related to cities or towns, where there are more buildings, businesses, and people living in close proximity
Working Group	group of individuals from different backgrounds and organizations who collaborate to support the integration of newcomers into Canadian society
