Catholic Social Services Edmonton	No Newcomer Goes Hungry The project is a collaboration between Catholic Social Services (CSS), Action for Healthy Communities (AHC), and Comfort Inn and Suites Downtown Edmonton (CIS). The NNGH project aims to offer hot breakfast to Ukrainian evacuees during their stay at CIS for up to 14 days. This is designed to help support IRCC's commitment to helping Ukrainians upon arrival to Canada through subsidized hotel rooms. Additionally, this project supports Ukrainian evacuees with gift cards to purchase additional food items.	CA\$26,390.00
Catholic Social Services – Red Deer Red Deer	Job Readiness and Community Bridging Program (JRCBP) The project offers Job Readiness and Community building to Ukrainians arriving into the city. Red Deer receives the third greatest number of displaced Ukrainians. The goal of the project is to increase Ukrainians job readiness skills and work culture through group learning and volunteering.
