ENGAGEMENT, RESEARCH, AND POLICY

AAISA's Engagement, Research, and Policy team has expanded and refined its work over the past year. For the first time, we produced a Sector Survey report, which provided insights on the needs of the sector and informed programming across the organization.

Our regional engagement initiatives with agencies in Small Centres, Calgary, and Edmonton provided opportunities to enhance communication and collaboration on issue-based projects. The Small Centres Toolkit was launched in May 2019, based on the specific needs of agencies. Additionally, staff convened the Refugee Claimants Response Committee, which brought issues forward to build recommendations for policy advocacy efforts.

Over the past year, AAISA offered a variety of online, face-to-face and blended training courses, including *Professionalism and Ethics Management Training, Creating a Culture of Respect,* and *Professional Roles and Ethics.* The PD team is excited to develop and broaden the online delivery of courses across the PNT region.

AAISA continues to offer the only certification for qualified settlement practitioners. We were proud to certify seven settlement practitioner certificate applications this year. Additionally, in an effort to be more inclusive, a French component was also added to our Settlement Practitioner certificates. Our three committees - the Regional Committee, the Certification Committee, and the Professional Development Committee - met regularly to discuss and move the work forward. The newly established Regional PD Committee with the goal to continue the advance professional excellence and growth across the PNT region.

Moving into the new year, AAISA is eager to continue to lead and facilitate the professionalism and growth in the settlement and integration sector across the PNT region.
